## CCNM Residence Warning Point System

Residents who disrespect the rules and expectations outlined in the CCNM Residence Handbook will be subject to the following disciplinary action. Resident Advisors and Residence Management have the right to issue warnings and the numbers of points administered for the infraction are subject to their discretion. There are three violation categories organized according to their severity. The influence of alcohol and other drugs does not constitute an excuse for any of these actions. Once a point is acquired it will stay on the resident's record for one year following the date of the incident then will be erased. If a resident has accumulated three points at any one time they will receive a warning letter and be called in for a meeting with Residence Management. At this time the infractions will be discussed and the resident will be informed of the potential for eviction if six points are accumulated.

Point values for new and/or not-covered violations will be determined by Residence Management.

The following list outlines the three violation categories, their minimum point assessment and examples of infractions for each category:

### **First Degree Violation – Minimum Three Point Assessment**

Violations in this category cause direct or potential harm, threat or inconvenience to others in residence. According to the severity of these infractions, they may constitute grounds for immediate eviction and banishment from CCNM Residence. Violations include, but are not limited to:

- Disorderly conduct involving destructive, abusive, or disruptive activities.
- Acts of violence or threats of violence against any member or guest of CCNM Residence.
- Physical violence.
- Foul and abusive language or gestures to faculty, staff, administrators, Residence Advisors, etc.
- Sexual, racial, religious, or disabled harassment, either physical, verbal, or written
- Sexual assault, including date/acquaintance rape.
- Harassment.
- Hazing.
- Inadequate care of college property (i.e., keys, door codes, etc.).
- Tampering with fire alarms, extinguishers and/or fire fighting equipment.
- Theft or vandalism.
- Breaking and entering.
- Disposing items out of a window.
- Selling, purchasing, using or possessing drugs and/or other illegal substances.
- Possessing and/or using a dangerous weapon, firearms, explosives or fireworks.
- Theft of a key/door code.
- Non-compliance; failure to comply with the directions of CCNM officials or designated agents acting in the performance of their duties.
- Smoking on CCNM property.

### **Second Degree Violation – Minimum Two Point Assessment**

Violations in this category are serious and cause a serious inconvenience to others in residence. Violations include, but are not limited to:

- Theft or vandalism.

- Unauthorized possession/use of any residence key/door code.
- Endangerment of public areas (i.e., broken bottle on floor, unattended food on stove etc.).
- Failure to produce ID upon the request of CCNM officials or designated agents.
- Failure to evacuate when the fire alarm sounds.
- Pets in residence halls/rooms.
- Improper use of telephone or e-mail.
- Repetition of any third degree offense.

### **Third Degree Violation – Minimum One Point Assessment**

Violations in this category do not cause a threat or limited inconvenience to others in residence. They are first time violations of CCNM Residence policies. Violations include, but are not limited to:

- First alcohol policy violation.
- Noise violation.
- Guest policy violation.
- Unauthorized furniture in residence room.
- Noxious odour/fragrance.
- Hallway obstruction.
- Disobeying lounge cleanliness guidelines.
- Missing three consecutive lounge meetings without advance notice.
