Terms of Award

The scholarship will be awarded to a Canadian status Indian, Inuit or member of a recognized First Nations band including Métis.

Other criteria include:

- The applicant has been a Canadian resident for the last twelve consecutive months.
- The applicant has successfully completed all admission requirements of The Canadian College of Naturopathic Medicine and has been granted acceptance to the Doctor of Naturopathic Medicine program.

The following are the terms of the Scholarship:

- 1) Every year, applications submitted will be reviewed to determine a recipient for this scholarship.
 - The awarding of the scholarship will be reviewed for renewal annually.
 - The scholarship will be paid directly to The Canadian College of Naturopathic Medicine on behalf of the student. The scholarship will support tuition fees for the four-year program.
 - A student selected for receipt of a scholarship must:
 - a) be born and educated in Canada (up to and including highschool).
 - b) demonstrate a potential for making a significant future contribution to holistic medicine and native herbal remedies with a desire to continue to search for new remedies.
 - c) deliver educational presentations or make contributions to the community as defined by The Canadian College of Naturopathic Medicine.
 - d) be selected on the basis of academic achievement, leadership potential and commitment to helping other First Nations peoples.
 - e) maintain good academic standing throughout the four-year program.
- 2) Should the selection process result in two applicants who are of equal merit, the Canadian College of Naturopathic Medicine reserves the right to divide the scholarship equally between them.
- 3) If for any reason, a recipient is unable to complete the year, the funds for the remaining scholarship period will be awarded to another First Nations student. The new recipient will abide by all of the requirements and criteria defined in Sections 1 and 2 outlined herein.
